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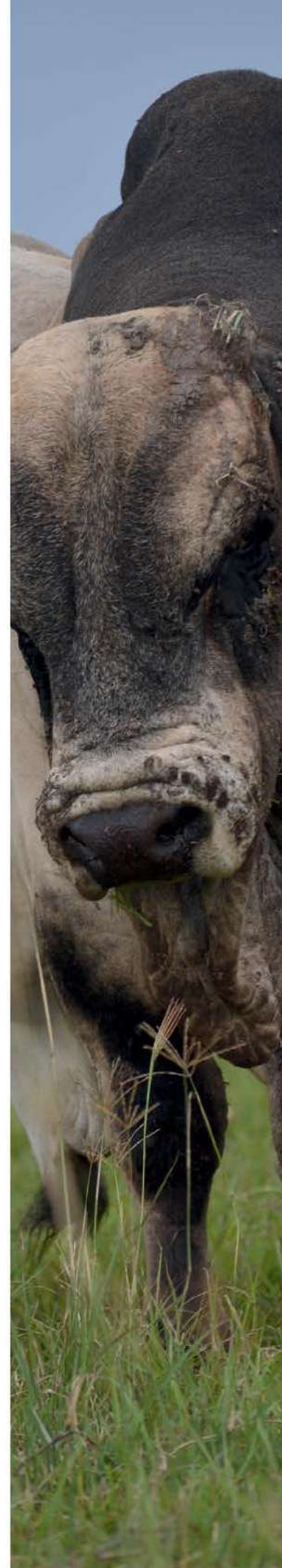

Rules & Regulations for Visitors

To ensure the safety, enjoyment, and smooth running of the event, all visitors are required to adhere to the following rules and regulations:

1. Entry & Registration

- All visitors must register at the main gate and obtain an official wristband or pass before entering.
- Children under 12 must be accompanied and supervised by an adult at all times.
- Entry is at the discretion of the event organisers.

2. Safety Around Livestock

- Do not enter cattle pens, auction holding areas, or restricted zones unless accompanied by authorised personnel.
- Avoid sudden movements, loud noises, or flash photography around animals.
- Never feed, touch, or attempt to move animals without the breeder's consent.

3. Auction Rules

- Only registered bidders may participate in the auction. *See full Auction Rules and Regulations for details.*
- Bidders must obtain a bidding number from the registration desk.
- All sales are final, and payment terms must be honored as stated in the auction catalogue.

4. General Conduct

- Respect all breeders, staff, volunteers, and fellow visitors.
- Follow all instructions given by security or event marshals.
- Disorderly, abusive, or disruptive behavior will not be tolerated and may result in removal from the event.

5. Prohibited Items & Activities

- No weapons, alcohol, illegal substances, or dangerous items allowed on site.
- Smoking is permitted only in designated areas.
- Pets are not allowed, except for registered service animals.
- Open fires are strictly prohibited due to fire risk.
- No littering. Use the bins provided.

6. Health & Biosecurity

- Visitors may be required to walk through disinfectant footbaths or follow other biosecurity measures.
- Do not visit the event if you have been on another farm with livestock within the past 48 hours unless you have followed proper cleaning and disinfection procedures.

7. Photography & Media

- Photography is allowed for personal use, but professional photography or filming requires prior approval from event organisers.
- By entering the event, visitors consent to being photographed or filmed for promotional purposes.

8. Parking, Traffic & Littering

- Park only in designated parking areas and follow traffic marshals' directions.
- The event organisers accept no responsibility for loss or damage to vehicles or belongings.
- Bins will be provided; please do not litter.

9. Catering

- Rusty Nail is the sole caterer for the event.

10. Charges, Membership & Show Catalogue

- You can become an Individual Member for KES 5,000/- per year or a Rancher/Stud Breeder Member for KES 15,000/- per year.
- Non-Members entry fees; KES 1,500/- for Friday (lunch not included), KES 2,500/- for Saturday (including lunch), or KES 4,000/- for both days (including Saturday lunch).
- Paid members may bring up to 3 guests; any extra person will be charged as per daily rates.
- A printed show catalogue is available for KES 500/-.

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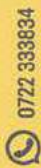


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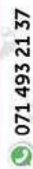

WELCOME TO THE 2025 BORAN CATTLE BREEDERS' SHOW

Kenya today is still the home of the Boran, in my view. Our inspections for registration are still conducted under stringent rules. No figures or EBVs are applied to our animals. Our Borans are raised in their natural environment and managed with good old-fashioned stockmanship. Our Borans today are medium framed animals, with width and length, they are well muscled, spring of rib with width between the eyes – not to mention their great mothering ability, milk and fertility and their tick resistance. For me one of the greatest attributes of the Boran is its conversion of sub-standard feed and fodder into quality beef. Their ability to fatten off the veld is amazing. I am saddened to hear how the Boran is maligned in certain southern African countries by the feedlots, saying they are not feedlot cattle. They have a lot to learn. The Boran is a phenomenal converter of feed and fodder. I will go so far as to say that the Boran is integral to any beef operation.

Our southern African fellow breeders have noted all the above attributes and the Boran is becoming integral to their beef operations. Today, the new story is Latin America. In Paraguay, the Boran is gaining ground and proving itself to commercial cattlemen and other Latin America countries are waking up to the advantages of the Boran. In Australia, the Boran is also starting to turn heads with commercial cattlemen, even though they have only old genetics dating from 1984 and obtained from Zambia.

I implore my fellow Boran breeders all over the world to keep the Boran in its natural form and not apply figures to it (EBVs) while upholding the Kenya Boran breed standards. I will part with stockman Pat Smith's famous saying that 'the Boran is God's gift to the cattleman'. Pat was a Kiwi who came to Kenya and he was very important to the Loldaiga stud and his beloved Solio stud, playing a major role in the Boran story. I am truly thankful to stockmen like Pat and the founders of this magnificent breed for their skills and dedication.

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SHOW JUDGING - PJ BUDLER



The 76th anniversary Boran Cattle Breeders' Show is incredibly fortunate to have PJ Budler here to judge. PJ was raised on a fifth generation cattle operation in South Africa. At age 15, he founded BonHaven Beef Cattle. Between 1996 and 2012 he grew BonHaven to five locations in three different countries. The Hereford, Angus, Red Angus, Braford and Brahman herds achieved much success, winning numerous National Shows and setting auction records on the continent.

In 2012, PJ relocated to Texas, USA, where he is the International Business Manager for Trans Ova Genetics. This position, together with running the annual "Champion of the World" Competition, judging shows, speaking at events and cattle industry consulting has taken him to 48 US states and 120 different countries thus far. He has judged 105 different cattle breeds in 49 countries. In 2017, PJ became the first to ever judge a National Show on six continents. According to PJ, 'To fully understand Boran, I had to see them in Kenya – co-mingling with the Big Five, with herdsman, at altitude and on the Equator.

'Boran is the tropically adapted solution to fertility, longevity, udder quality, foot integrity, high inherent body condition and sexual dimorphism. Extensive Clay Center (Kansas, USA) research showed Boran's superiority over all breeds in producing F1 females and the dominance that the F1 steers have over other tropical cattle in terms of carcass yields.

'Over a millennium of natural selection in East Africa followed by a genius tweak by the pioneers of the Improved or Kenyan Boran has created a breed of cattle that is what the global beef industry has been searching and researching for... it's just time to let the secret out.'

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HISTORY OF THE BORAN

The Boran breed has its genetic roots deep in the history of the great migrations of *Bos taurus* and *Bos indicus* cattle, domesticated in Africa and imported into the continent during the last nine millennia. In the first phase of the great Boran's story, we can pay tribute to the pastoralists of Africa's Horn region, who for more than a thousand years developed the traits of the traditional breed in which Kenya's early ranchers, starting in the early 20th century onwards, saw potential. 'If the genetic background of the Kenyan Boran is predominantly zebu, the breed also contains taurine background of two separate origins. A European-Near East taurine background of some antiquity and most likely also from recent crossbreeding and an African indigenous taurine background which is not found in any Asian zebu crosses such as Sahiwal or Brahman.' (O.Hanotte. See also M.Okomo et al. 1998, J.E.O Rege et al. 2001).

More to the point, scientists 'identify a major taurine x indicine cattle admixture event dated to circa 750-1,050 years ago, which has shaped the genome of today's cattle in the Horn of Africa... Our findings indicate that a combination of past taurine and recent indicine admixture-derived genetic resources is at the root of the present success of African pastoralism and commercial ranching, of which the Kenya Boran is a great example.' (Kwondo Kim et al. 2020).

From around 1911, the Laikipia and Rift Valley rancher Gilbert Colvile first began working with Borans, which in those days were still known as Northern Frontier District or 'Frontier' cattle. Colvile, known by the Maasai as *Nyasore* – the Lean Man – was a tough stockman who became dedicated to indigenous cattle at a time when other ranchers were still struggling to introduce exotic breeds. 'He could only talk about cattle and rain,' said one of his Naivasha neighbours.

Eventually, Colvile ranched 20,000 cattle across 236,000 acres and between the two world wars his Borans helped to establish the nucleus herds for cattlemen such as Miles Fletcher on Suguroi, David Begg in Gilgil and probably Douglas Hinde at Loldaiga. The genetics of the Borans on Soysambu, Delamere Estates, today are possibly closest to Colvile's original NFD Borans.

Most early Borans were trekked to Laikipia from southern Ethiopia, where the cattle had greater size, better mothering ability and milkiness than their lowland cousins in northern Kenya and southern Somalia, where they are known as 'Awai'. These hardier cattle – smaller, lighter-boned, more trypanotolerant – were less sought after, though in around 1927, Brian Curry is said to have encountered Orma Boran while hunting elephant north of the Tana River. He acquired 120 heifers for his farm at Mutara, the very location where this year's BCBS Show is being held.

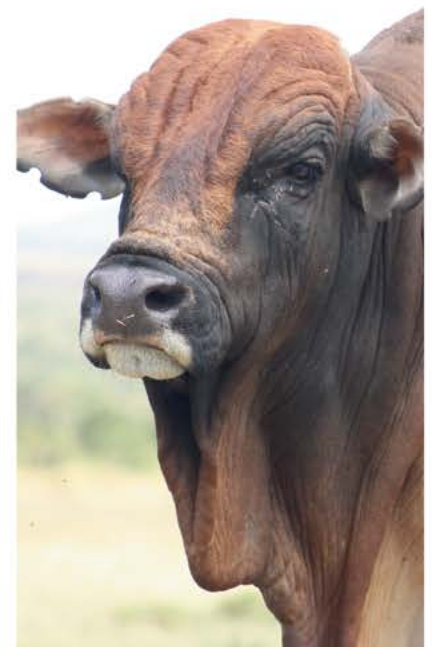
Before World War Two, crossbreeding of these frontier cattle with Shorthorn, Red Poll, Hereford and South Devons introduced a stronger boned beast, but as things progressed ranchers focused ever more on improving the Boran as a breed in itself. Thereafter the Boran became a characteristic breed of farms and ranches across the Laikipia plateau, in the Rift Valley, west of the Rift and southeastern Kenya between Nairobi and the Coast. Following the War, breeders joined to establish the Boran Cattle Breeders' Society and agree the breed standards some 76 years ago.

Expansion of Borans across Africa followed. In 1947, the first Suguroi Borans were exported to Northern Rhodesia, now Zambia, while extensive herds were set up in West Kilimanjaro and other parts of Tanganyika from the early 1950s. By the sixties and seventies, following Kenya's independence from Britain, cattle were being sent south to Zambia and westwards by train to Uganda, Rwanda-Burundi and Zaire (now the Democratic Republic of Congo). In 1963, Miles Fletcher famously attempted to emigrate to South Africa with his selection of bulls and heifers, but he was turned away and diverted back to Zambia. In 1984, Kenya's authorities refused the export of genetics to Australia, which were then sourced from Zambia.

The breed and society's fortunes have always depended on the energy and talent of the individual breeders. The names are legendary: New Zealander Pat Smith, on Loldaiga from the 1950s, then Solio; Norman Peckover, who farmed the 10,400 acre Nzai ranch near Sultan Hamud until the 1970s and bred a 'good, solid type of Boran'; Jane and John Kenyon, who established the Mogwooni stud from 1963; Charlie Stone-Wigg, who managed Suguroi for 17 years after it was bought by Gianni Ltd; David and Jane Stanley, Anne Joyce and FOB Wilson at Ulu; Miles Fletcher's son Simon, who farmed at Sirima until 1978 – when his stock was sold to improve herds at Ol Pejeta under John Poulton and Segerera under John Cousens.

With the departure from Kenya of significant breeders between the sixties and eighties, the BCBS lost momentum. 'Beef prices were terrible and diseases got out of hand, so there were no exports,' recalls Mogwooni's Jackie Kenyon. As Giles Prettejohn remembers, it was Robin Slade of ADC Mutara, 'whose enthusiasm kept the Society active until exports livened up in the nineties, and put the registered stock in good stead when Zimbabwe and South Africa came knocking.'

Embryo exports to southern Africa in the 1990s breathed fresh life into the BCBS, including the importation by Zimbabwe's Forrester Estates of 500 + embryos flushed at Ol Pejeta from 100 cows and 12 bulls by Dr Percy Sharp; the flushing by Ronnie and Morne de la Rey of Embryo Plus of embryos for export to South Africa followed in a project led by Simon Hodgson, David Green and Douglas Ralfe; further flushes happened in 2000, 2006 to 2011 and most recently in the last couple of years. This century via South Africa, Boran genetics have made their way to several countries in the Americas – and the Society is delighted to welcome breeders from several Latin American countries to the Show in Kenya this year.

New energy in the Society from the 1980s was driven by a younger generation of up-and-coming cattlemen, such as Giles Prettejohn on Ol Pejeta, Jackie Kenyon on Mogwooni and then later Mark Myatt-Taylor, who with his wife Nicky established the Woragus stud in Kenya during the 1990s, moving to Tanzania for a few years early this century. The Agriculture Society of Kenya (ASK) and LBSS shows also drove enthusiasm to establish studs out of existing herds of commercial Borans. In 1992, Gilfrid Powys registered his foundation herd on Kisima (now Suyian), while in 1993 the Stanleys at Ulu registered 30 heifers and brought in Solio bulls 109 and 343.

Legendary bulls such as Suguroi's 'Station Master' didn't just win shows – their genetics determined the style and direction of Kenya's famous Boran herds. Solio's stud under Pat Smith in the sixties and seventies sold its genetics 'everywhere'. The Peckover line was highly sought after long after the breeder left Kenya in the 1970s.

2247 from Suguroi's incredibly influential Gianni line sired 1279, which was among Ol Pejeta's most prolific bulls of the 1990s. Mutara 54 was bought by Segera and his progeny found their way into most breeders' herds. His line continues on Ol Pejeta. Gianni 2812 and Segera 956 largely founded the Woragus stud – and Woragus 24, 147, 202, 703 and 788 have spread their progeny far and wide.

Whereas indigenous Borans from the Horn region are a smaller, narrower, lighter-boned animal, early photographs of improved cattle on Laikipia ranches show a much larger frame, perhaps with the infusion of exotic genetics from Shorthorn or Red Poll. 'They were slower maturing, strong and they were big,' recalls Mike Littlewood, who worked on the late Colvile ranches from 1967, after Gilbert's former wife Lady Diana Delamere had inherited Lerematesho Ltd. The enterprise was sending 100 steers a month to the Kenya Meat Commission (in which Colvile had been a co-founder) and for the price of around 15 steers in those days one could purchase a new Toyota Landcruiser.

Today, the sense is that towards the end of last century, some society members were breeding cattle that were too big. 'The South Africans took the biggest cattle to compete with the Brahman. It was a mistake for us Kenyans,' one cattleman remembers. When Prettejohn first worked on Ol Pejeta in the mid-1990s even cows got up to 600 kilos. 'The 2000 drought taught us a lesson - after that we went down to an average 430 kilo cow and the best thing we did was go down,' says Prettejohn. Around the turn of the century, leading breeders corrected direction and have seen ever greater success with better adapted, medium-sized cattle, broad between the eyes so that the width goes all the way back. Improvements in standards are based on ranchers making decisions on site in the boma, rather than relying on tables of data and measurements. Society members are also highly selective and disciplined about which cattle deserve registration to qualify for the stud. In its 76th year, the studs which make up the Boran Cattle Breeders' Society of Kenya remain the wellspring of genetics for the beef industry worldwide.

Class 3 – Females 2.5 -3 yo must be in calf or have a calf at foot **Born 1st Oct 2022 to 31st March 2023** (The Brian Hartley Plate)

Class 4- Females 3 to 4yo – **Born 1st Oct 2021 to 30 Sep 2022, must have a calf at foot (max 8 months old) and must have tattoo in ear and birth notification records.**

Class 5- Group of three Heifers (Any three heifers from classes 1,2 & 3). (Lady Anne Delamere Cup)

Class 6- The Cooper Trophy for Champion Female (selected from 1st and 2nd of classes 1,2,3 & 4)

BULLS:

Class 7- Bulls under 2yo: **Born on or after 1st Oct 2023** (Alistair Reith- Hennessy Memorial Mug)

Class 8- Bulls 2 -2.5yo **Born 1st April 2023 -30th. Sept 2023** (The Maria Dodds Trophy)

Class 9 -Bulls 2.5-3yo **Born 1st Oct 2022 to 31st March 2023** (The Gilfred Powys Memorial Trophy)

Class 10- The Harold White Memorial Trophy for the **Best Bull under three years** (from classes 7,8 & 9)

Class 11 –Bulls 3-4yo **Born 1st Oct 2021 to 30th. Sept 2022** (The Charlie Stone-Wigg Memorial Trophy)

Class 12- Bulls 4-5yo **Born 1st Oct 2020 to 30th. Sept 2021** (The Jane Stanley Memorial Trophy)

Class 13- Almatix Trophy for **Champion bull** (Selected from 1st and 2nd of classes 7,8,9,11 & 12)

Class 14-The Agriner Cup for the winner of **The Progeny Class** (Minimum of three cattle of which two must be bulls all by the same sire).

Class 15- The Pat Smith Stockmans Trophy (To be awarded to the exhibitor with the **Best turned out and handled group**. Judged in conjunction with class 14)

Class 16- Registered Boran and F1 Boran Females – Pen of 3 Females (Any age, Pure Boran, beef cross or dairy cross F1's); not halter trained. The Pen of Registered Boran Females can be entered for the auction as a pen of 3.

Class 17- Pen of 3 steers Boran or FI Boran crosses, max 4 teeth.

THE SHOW TROPHIES

FEMALES:

Class 2- *The George Aggett Memorial Trophy*, for Females 2 – 2½ years

George Aggett farmed on Kifuku Estate until his tragic death in an aeroplane accident in September 2016, soon after winning several trophies at the Boran show of that year. As a dedicated stockman he had continued the tradition of breeding natural poll Kifuku Borans started by his grandfather in the 1920s. His family dedicated this trophy to the memory of a modest yet forthright cattleman.

Class 3 – *The Brian Hartley Plate*, for Females 2½ - 3 years

Hartley was an early European breeder of the Frontier or NFD cattle trekked down the borderlands of Ethiopia and Somalia. He was among the founding members of the BCBS 76 years ago and judged at the Kenya shows of that time. In the early 1950s, he took some of the first Borans to his ranching operations in Tanganyika. The trophy plate is presented by his son Aidan of Frontier Cattle (Kenya) Ltd.

Class 5 – *The Lady Anne Delamere Cup* , for a Group of Three Heifers (any three heifers from classes 1,2 & 3)

This trophy was donated by Lord and Lady Delamere, after Delamere won that class at one of the early Brookside Shows.

Class 6- *The Cooper Trophy* for Champion Female (selected from 1st and 2nd of classes 1, 2, 3 & 4)

The trophy was donated by the company, a regular supporter of Boran events.

BULLS:

Class 7- *The Alistair Reith-Hennessy Memorial Mug*, for Bulls under 2 years

Alistair was a keen stockman and farmer. After graduating from the Royal Agricultural University, Cirencester, in 2004 he joined his sister Nicky and her husband Mark Myatt-Taylor who were farming in Tanzania. He helped at many of the LBSS shows in Nairobi as well as showing the Myatt-Taylors' Woragus Boran Stud cattle. He was taken too early in a tragic motorbike accident in 2007. This trophy is dedicated to the memory of an up-and-coming stockman who was young, spirited and full of life.

Class 8- *The Maria Dodds Trophy*, for Bulls 2 – 2½ years

Maria's determination, instinctive knowledge and admiration of the breed since childhood meant that she was able to preserve and protect the Kifuku Estates' valuable genetics. Enduring droughts and political instability, she ensured the Kifuku Boran bloodline remained strong and true. This trophy recognises the grit, resilience and love for Borans that go into breeding a show winner.

Class 9 - *The Gilfrid Powys Memorial Trophy*, for Bulls 2½ - 3years

The late Gilfrid Powys was a dedicated Boran cattleman and Supreme Champion Bull winner.

Class 10- *The Harold White Memorial Trophy* for the Best Bull under three years (from classes 7,8 & 9)

Gilfrid Powys donated this trophy in memory of the long-serving committee member.

Class 11 – *The Charlie Stone-Wigg Memorial Trophy*, for Bulls 3 – 4 years

Charlie Stone-Wigg and his wife Ann managed Gianni Ltd., Suguroi Estate, for 17 years after 1963. At its peak there were 3,500 to 4,000 head. They were ardent BCBS supporters and Charlie was a respected inspector and show judge until his death in 2004, mentoring many young Boran breeders. His family awarded this trophy in view of his love for the Boran and in recognition of his contribution to the breed.

Class 12 - *The Jane Stanley Memorial Trophy* for Bulls 4 - 5years

Jane and David Stanley farmed in the Ulu hills of Makueni County, south eastern Kenya. Jane spearheaded the milk processing and administrative duties until she was diagnosed with cancer in 2008. The Stanleys ran the early Livestock Breeders Show & Sale under the chairmanship of Mary Nevill and with Nancy Shaban they ran the show office and the treasury until Brookside took over.

Class 13 - *Almatix Trophy* for Champion Bull (Selected from 1st and 2nd of classes 7,8,9,11 & 12)

The Almatix Trophy was donated by the company, a regular supporter of Boran events;

Class 14 - *The Agriner Cup* for the winner of The Progeny Class (minimum of three cattle of which two must be bulls all by the same sire).

Donated by Agriner Development Ltd -- big supporters of the early Boran shows at Ol Pejeta and the at the start of the Brookside Shows.

Class 15 - *The Pat Smith Stockman's Trophy* (To be awarded to the exhibitor with the best turned out and handled group. Judged in conjunction with class 14)

The trophy was donated by Pat Smith, veteran manager of Loldaiga and Solio Borans and a true Showman who knew all the tricks of the trade.

The Gilani Trophy for the Champion Pen of Steers (donated by the late Gilani of ABC Butchery in Nairobi).

The Kinguku Trophy for the Single Fattest Steer (donated by Muriithi Kinguku in memory of his father. Mzee Kinguku was the best known buyer of fat cattle from Laikipia ranches for several decades).

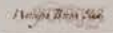

2. Eligibility to Participate

All Buyers are required to register before participating in the auction, providing complete contact details and any necessary proof of identity.

The Society retains the discretion to deny entry or bidding privileges to any individual.

3. Conditions of Sale

Sales will be conducted following BCBS regulations and applicable Kenyan laws.

The Buyer is determined by the highest bid as recognized by the auctioneer.

Decisions made by the auctioneer are final.

4. Warranties & Representations

Unless otherwise stated in the catalogue or announced at the auction, all animals are sold "as inspected" and "as is".
